758 Squadron will be conducting a 2 Day Field Training Exercise activity as part of our mandatory training at Claireville Conservation Area, 8180 Hwy 50, Brampton, ON, L6T 0A6 on 14-15 May 2022. This will be a daytime only activity. Cadets are expected to participate fully on both days.

Cadets will report to Claireville Conservation Area, main parking lot, 8180 Hwy 50, Brampton ON, L6T 0A6 at 0800 hrs (8:00 am) on both Saturday 14 May and on Sunday 15 May 2022 and must be picked up each day at the same location, NO LATER THAN 1600hrs (4:00pm).

Dress for cadets is Field Training Uniforms. Cadets must bring with them their Health Card and personal kit as per the Personal Kit List (attached). Cadets are required to have breakfast prior to being dropped off on Saturday/Sunday. Lunch will be provided each day. Cadets may bring snacks, and water will be provided for refilling personal water bottles.

Cadets with epi-pens or inhalers must bring them with them or they will not be allowed to participate. Medications brought on this activity must be in the original container which shall be clearly marked with Cadets name as well as usage instructions.

Parent / Guardian are asked to complete this form as well as the Inspection Consent Form and submit to **CV Singh** by no later than **Monday 2 May 2022 @ 21:30 hrs (9:30pm)**. Please keep a copy of this form for yourself.

NOTE: Health Card check will be done by staff before parents may depart. Cadet will not be able to participate in the activity if they do not have a health card, inappropriate or insufficient kit, and signed Permission, and Inspection Consent Form.

INSPECTIONS AND SEARCHES

At different moments during the training or activity, the cadet may be subjected to an inspection of his/her sleeping accommodations, luggage, kit, equipment, locker(s) or storage area(s). These will be conducted or supervised by a Canadian Armed Forces member, and will serve to verify that:

- the cadet's sleeping accommodations, locker(s) and storage area(s) are clean and orderly;
- the cadet is carrying the proper equipment and it is in good condition and properly maintained;
- the cadet's health and safety is not at risk; and
- the cadet does not have prohibited, restricted or unauthorized items in his/her possession, as listed in the joining instructions or other information document provided under separate correspondence.

If found, prohibited and restricted items will be handed to the applicable police agency (military or civilian) with some exceptions, while unauthorized items shall either be confiscated for the duration of the training or activity or sent back to the cadet's home at the parents expense, whichever is more practical and economical with some exceptions.

Corrective measures could be taken against a cadet for failing any criteria or search or for refusing to submit to an inspection, in accordance with CATO 15-22 Conduct and Discipline – Cadets, up to and including being expelled from the training or activity.

If needed, searches of a cadet's person, property, lockers, luggage, kit or sleeping area for the purposes of discovering contraband, illicit or stolen property, or some evidence of guilt to be used in the prosecution of an offence, will be conducted only by the Military Police or a civilian police agency.

S'il y a lieu d'effectuer la fouille du cadet lui-même, de ses effets personnels, casiers, bagages, fourbi ou chambre dans le but de découvrir de la contrebande, des objets illégaux ou volés, ou toute preuve de culpabilité pouvant servir à sa poursuite en justice, seule la Police militaire ou un service de police civil l'effectuera.

Personal Kit List

Day Activity, Temperate Weather

1. Dress

- a. Dress is Field Training Uniforms (FTU) including issued FTU shirt, pants, multipurpose boot, belt, beret and wool socks. Cadet parka including fleece liner is recommend to be brought and worn as weather dictates, alternately Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) ICE coat or CAF 3 seasons coat in olive drab colour may be worn if privately purchased. Note that Cadets will not possess or wear CADPAT or other type camouflage uniforms.
- b. Cadets not in possession of their field training uniform may wear privately purchased FTUs or civilian clothing. Clothing must be suitable to be used in the field and will get dirty. Civilian hiking boots or CAF combat boots may be worn in lieu of FTU multipurpose boot with civilian clothing. Boots must be a style suitable for hiking. Running shoes will not be permitted.

2. Equipment

- a. Cadets shall bring with them the following items in a conservative civilian or military style backpack suitable for field training:
 - i. Water bottle and 1L of water
 - ii. Small Individual First Aid Kit
 - iii. Rain jacket and pants or poncho
 - iv. Gloves, toque / field cap
 - v. 1 pair spare liner and outer socks
 - vi. Spare clothes as required
 - vii. Sun glasses
 - viii. Sun screen
 - ix. Bug spray
 - x. Writing material and pen
 - xi. Snacks if desired.

3. Other

- a. Cadets are encouraged to use a two sock system with a thin liner sock of polypropylene type material and their issued outer wool socks as this will minimize foot injuries due to blisters.
